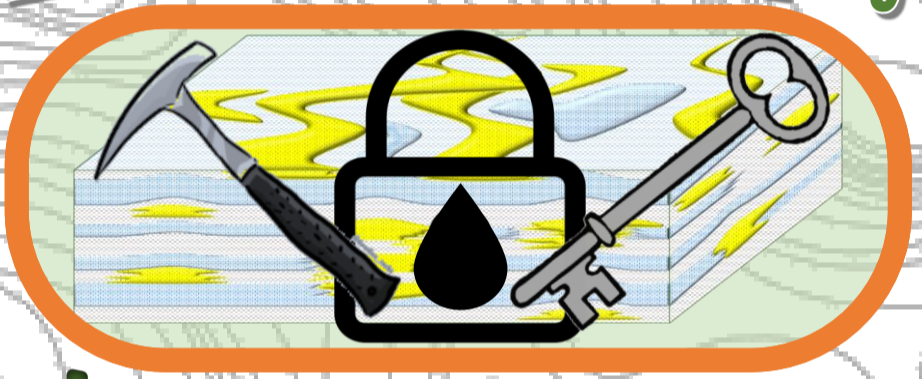

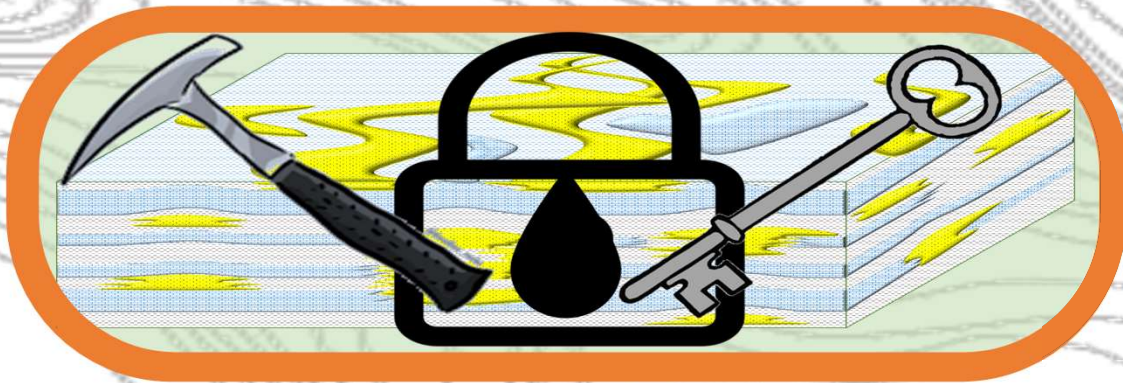

This field trip will feature stops in Taylor, Nolan, Mitchell and other counties to view Permian San Angelo Formation fluvial facies, Permian Leonard limestone, Cretaceous dolostone, ooid shoal, rudistid reef facies, and basal Cretaceous fluvial-estuarine sandstones. A highlight will be exploring the Cup and Saucer, a crater or sinkhole exposing Triassic Dockum Group and Quaternary volcanic ash. The Cup and Saucer was perhaps last visited by geologists on a 1962 San Angelo Geological Society Field Trip.
